- identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains;
- monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains; and
- protect whistle blowers.

Supplier adherence to our values

To ensure all those in our supply chain and contractors comply with our values we are improving our supplier contracting systems together with updating our supply chain evaluation and auditing programme.

Training

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, training will be provided to our employees.
